Notice under Regulation 10 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012

- 1. At least 28 clear days before a private meeting, the decision-making body must make available at its offices a notice of the intention to hold the meeting in private, and must also publish that notice on their website (if they have one)2.
- 2. The notice referred to in paragraph I above must also include a statement of the reasons for the meeting to be held in privates.
- 3. At least 28 clear days before making a key decision, the decision-making body must make available at its offices a notice of the intention to make that decision, and must also publish that notice on their website (if they have one) 5
- 4. The notice referred to in paragraph 3 above must include a statement of the reasons for the meeting to be held in private, details of any representations received about why the meeting should be open to the public, and a statement of its response to any such questions. Where the date by which a meeting must be held makes compliance with the above requirements impractical, the meeting may only be held in private and a key decision taken where the decision-making body has obtained agreement from the chairman of the relevant overview and scrutiny committee that the meeting is urgent and cannot reasonably be deferred6.

4 'Key Decision' means an executive decision, which is likely to result in the relevant local authority incurring expenditure which is, or the making of savings which are, significant having regard to the relevant local authority's budget for the service of function to which the decision relates; or to be significant in terms of its effects on communities living or working in an area comprising two or more wards or electoral divisions in the area of the relevant local authority

A 'private meeting means a meeting, or part of a meeting, of the decision-making body during which the public are excluded due to the confidential or exempt nature of the business being transacted
